Greetings from Forest Glen! It is hard to believe that we are back at school after a quick summer. The faculty and staff approach the new school year with much enthusiasm and spirit. Our students and staff have had a great start and the students are doing extremely well. Please remember that we are all here to help your child be successful. If at any time you would like to discuss topics or issues that may need clarification, please call the office or your child's teacher. Your discussions are always welcome!

Thank you to all of our families that attended our Curriculum Nights during the first few weeks of school. These evenings are important for you to begin your connections with your child's teachers. We appreciate you taking the time to attend.

This year, Glen Ellyn School District 41 will continue to use the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) test in reading and math. Students in Kindergarten through Grade 8 will take these online tests three times this year. The fall testing window is September 7 - 23, during which your child will spend approximately two hours completing MAP tests. Results for each of your child's tests will be shared with you at fall conferences.

Please remember to review with your child how you would like them to go home each day. Whether they are a bus rider, a car rider, or a walker, you should be clear in your expectations for how you would like your child to come home. Also, please make sure that your child's teacher is aware of your preferred mode of transportation. If it is necessary to change the typical way your child will come home, please let your child's teacher know. Teachers cannot check e-mails or voice mails when they are teaching, so if your plans change and you are unsure whether your child's teacher will receive the message in time, please call the office to let us know. Our staff wants to work closely with you to ensure that your child arrives at school safely and arrives safely to your home.

The Forest Glen staff is very excited to partner with you and your children this year. Please know that you may call us at any time if you have a comment, a suggestion, or a concern. Digital Media

Book Circulation

For most students, book checkout is completed on a flexible schedule throughout the week. Students come to the LMC to search for books and use a self checkout system. Students may borrow up to 3 books at a time, for the duration of 2 weeks. (Some limitations are in place for Early Childhood and Kindergarten. These students may borrow 1 book at a time, for the duration of 1 week.)

Bluestem Book Lists Grades 3-5

All students in grades 3-5 are encouraged to participate in our Bluestem reading incentives program this year. There will be 3 major events for Bluestem readers throughout the year. To qualify for these events, students read award-winning books from the Bluestem book list and are required to submit a Bluestem Review Form.

The Bluestem events are as follows:

February 16th, before school (read 4 and submit 4 reviews) April 12th, at lunch (read 10 and submit 10 reviews)

May 17th, after school (read all 20 and submit 20 reviews)

New Devices & GAFE (Google Apps for Education) Accounts

District 41 has provided all students with a new device for learning. Students are now using the Dell Chromebook 11. The Chromebook is a new, faster computer. It starts in seconds and uses GAFE (Google Apps for Education) apps with unlimited cloud storage. Students can access their GAFE accounts from school and from home. Students log in using their username@d41.org and the password is their student ID number (the 2080 number). Please note that the email application is disabled, and other restrictions are applied.

Acceptable Use Policy

Easier access to technology must be paired with clear expectations for our students. Just as parents are asked to sign an Acceptable Use Policy, our students review a kid-friendly version during DIgital Media class. These expectations are initially explained to all students in grades 1-5 and reviewed throughout the year.



Pumpkin Parade / Fall Fest

Costume Requirements: Students may not wear masks or headgear which obscure identity or create a safety concern, costume paraphernalia, such as theatrical props, imitation or real weapons, gruesome or bloody articles, and costumes and/or make up which are considered threatening or otherwise inappropriate. Students should not wear revealing clothing articles, short skirts/shorts, spaghetti straps or halters, and should have their midriffs covered at all times. Metal, plastic, or rubber cleats, shoes with wheels, or other shoes that may damage the floors may not be worn. Scooters, skateboards, rollerblades, skates, play equipment, and electronic devices may not be used as part of a costume.

The 20th annual pumpkin parade will be held on Monday, October 31. All EC/PreK and Kindergarten students will wear their costumes for their AM or PM sessions. The AM EC/PreK / Kindergarten parades and parties will take place between 10 - 11 AM and 1:30 - 2:30 PM. Students in Grades 1 - 5 have an extended morning. Lunch will take place from 12:40 - 1:35 PM. Students should not wear their costumes to school in the morning. The Pumpkin Parade will start at 1:45 PM. Fall Fest parties will begin immediately after the conclusion of the parade and will conclude at 3:00 PM.

NOTIFICATION:

Head lice, which is a community based childhood nuisance, has intermittently been an occurrence with our students in School District 41. With camp outs, sleep overs, family get togethers, etc., we usually noticed an increase in the number of students with head lice, especially after holiday breaks and summer breaks.

Head lice, which are found worldwide, are parasitic insects that live close to the scalp and require human blood to survive. Head lice move by crawling; they have special legs that cling to individual hair shafts; they cannot hop or fly, and are spread by direct prolonged head to head contact with the hair of an infested person. They are <u>rarely</u> spread by contact with clothing or other personal items, as they do not live off of a human host for more than 1 – 2 days. Head lice do not spread disease.

You can help stop the spread of head lice by prevention, observation, appropriate treatment, and communication.

- Encourage your child to refrain from hugging, play wrestling, and other modes of head to head contact with other children.
- Please check your child's head throughout the school year; especially if they are complaining of an itchy scalp. If you would like information with descriptions of what lice nits and head lice look like, call the health office at your child's school or visit the web sites listed below.
- o If you discover lice or nits (lice eggs) you can use over the counter pediculocide shampoos (Rid or Nix). It is important that you follow the directions on the container. Do not repeat the shampoo more often than recommended. Check with your pediatrician and pharmacist for guidance if you have questions about the benefits or risks of any treatments. After shampooing, you must comb the hair and remove as many nits as possible, especially ones 1/4th inch or closer to the scalp. Removing as many nits as possible will help avoid confusion as you continue to check your child's head for the next few weeks.
- Please inform the health office staff if you detect head lice or nits so we can contact you to gather information
 to hopefully find out where the case of head lice may have originated. The health office maintains your
 child's confidentiality and is available to offer guidance in the treatment or follow-up care for the lice
 detection.
- District 41 has a new lice policy in effect (located on the main web site: www.d41.org. Click on School Board, then Board Policy Manual, locate Section 7: Students and scroll down to 7:250 AP2. This updated head lice policy reflects evidence based research conducted by the CDC (Center for Disease Control), ACP (American Academy of Pediatrics), and NASN (National Association of School Nurses.
- o The health office addresses head lice in the school setting, guided by recommendations set by the above stated reputable Federal resources. We highly regard confidentiality and are committed to work closely with parents/guardians to assist in eliminating the head lice pest by providing guidance and information in a nonjudgmental manner, with the goal being to eliminate/destroy lice/nits and minimize the possibility of reinfestation.

Dear Parent:

On Friday, November 11th, 2016 from 1:30pm to 3:00pm Forest Glen Elementary School <u>Fifth</u> graders will be **visited by the Robert Crown Education Center** in Hinsdale to learn about adolescent growth and development. This is a change from previous years when the students went to Robert Crown Center. The Robert Crown curriculum parallels District 41 health curriculum, and supports State of Illinois education standards in the areas of adolescent health; including adolescent health risk reduction, positive health practices, and effects of health related actions on body systems. While the general emphasis of instruction is on anatomy, bodily changes and basic hygiene, social and emotional aspects of entering puberty are also discussed. The 85 minute classes are separated by gender, with the boys attending the "Michael - Puberty Education for Boys Program", and the girls attending the "Linda - Puberty Education for Girls Program".

A Robert Crown curriculum Parent Information Night will be held in conjunction with all District 41 5th grade parents on Tuesday, September, 27th, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. at the Hadley LMC (240 Hawthorne Ave.). Parents (no students at this meeting) who have questions or would like further information about the program should join us that evening. Parents may also find out information about the Robert Crown Health Education Center and the "Michael" and "Linda" programs by visiting the Robert Crown website www.robertcrown.org.

All 5^{th} grade students will attend this event, unless a parent/guardian provides in writing to the teacher they want their child to opt out of the Robert Crown presentation.

Dear Forest Glen Families:

This year, Glen Ellyn School District 41 will continue to use the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) test in reading and math. Students in kindergarten through eighth grade will take these online tests three times a year in the fall, winter, and spring. The fall testing window is September 7 - September 23, during which your child will spend approximately two hours completing MAP tests.

The MAP Tests help determine your child's instructional level and measure academic growth throughout the school year, and from year to year. MAP tests are unique in that they are interactive, adapting to the appropriate learning level while your child is answering the questions. Therefore, the MAP test specifically measures your child's actual learning level, regardless of whether it is above or below grade level, and each student has the same opportunity to succeed and maintain a positive attitude toward testing. And MAP tests use less class time while providing detailed and accurate information to the teacher about your child's growth; usually, the teacher will have results by the following day. Results of each of your child's tests will be shared with you at fall conferences.

The MAP tests are being aligned to the Common Core State Standards in reading and math that Illinois adopted.

You can go to google.com and click "sign in" in the top right corner.






Step 2: Sign in to your student's account.
