## **Glen Ellyn School District** Historical review of D41's space challenges and full-day kindergarten



For more than six years, the Glen Ellyn School District 41 has been exploring offering full-day kindergarten with a goal of better preparing students for first grade and providing a strong educational foundation.

In 2016, a majority of both parents and non-parent survey respondents supported a full-day kindergarten:

In 2016, respondents shared comments supporting full-day kindergarten, as seen below:

"I really feel like half day kinder- garten programs do a disservice to families, students and teach- ers. At this age, kids are very ready to learn and we should take full advantage of this opportunity."	"I am at a loss to understand why District 41 does not pro- vide full day kindergarten, especially during these times where the majority of families are based on both parents working."	"My child attended full- day kindergarten in an- other state and benefited from it! I believe full-day kindergarten is a must (and, not an option). "
"Full-day kindergarten is extremely important and should be the district's highest priority."	"It is insane that we do not yet have full day kindergarten. Early educa- tion - critical for success later in life. For the taxes I pay to live in such a nice community I was shocked to learn that the district still employed half day kindergarten."	"Full day kindergarten is a must to stay competitive in the area. This doesn't necessarily mean this allows more time for instruction. There would be a balance between instruction, physical activity, social activities, and PBL learning."

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In 2019, it had become clear that D41 does not have the space needed to offer full-day kindergarten at each school and, therefore, would need to offer it at an alternative location.

With this context, parents were again asked if D41 should pursue a plan to offer full-day kindergarten. As seen in the chart to the left, support from parents for full-day kindergarten grew by 7% compared to 2016.

Enrollment is increasing each year and is projected to continue as home sales and overall population in the area rise. (Enrollment / Enrollment (d41.org))





One of the concerns for the community is that D41 will become less competitive. As seen in the graphic to the left, the majority (88.2%) of the Glenbard High School District feeder school districts and local private schools offer full-day kindergarten.
