Churchill Elementary School Deficiencies

At capacity right now - no room for additional growth

No staff eating space
No formal meeting/flexible space
Core spaces are used to full extent now
Crowded hallways during transition times
Traffic congestion at arrival/dismissal
Lack of safe and secure entryway

No room to grow - $\frac{2}{3}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$ size rooms will not hold class size targets.

Lunchroom/Gym - setup and cleanup of gym impacts scheduling of PE.

Student safety in and outside of building due to congestion.

Located on Bryant Avenue

K-Grade 5

Approximately 560 students

3 Self-contained Special Education Classes

Some classrooms very small

 No dedicated teacher workroom/lunchroom

New Library Media Center opened in 2014
Operates on a Middle School MOdel with Teaming
Only Junior High School in D41

Insufficient STEAM labs
