Call to Order

The Board of Education meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance

Vice President Drew Ellis led in the recital of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Electronic Participation

Board member John Kenwood was not able to attend the meeting in person due to an employment-related obligation. In accordance with District 41 policy, Mr. Kenwood notified the superintendent's office that he would not be physically present for the board meeting, but would like to participate in the meeting by phone.

Board members Drew Ellis moved and Sam Black seconded to approve Mr. Kenwood's participation by phone. On a roll call vote answering "Aye": Vondrak, Howard, Black, Ellis, Smith and Nelson

Roll Call

Upon the roll being called, the following members answered present: John Kenwood (participated by phone), Steve Vondrak, Dan Smith, Jr., Terra Costa Howard, Sam Black, Drew Ellis and Erica Nelson.

Presentations, Reports and Initiatives

Abraham Lincoln School Presentation: Led by Principal Linda Schweikhofer, Abraham Lincoln teachers and students gave a presentation on how the District 41 Learner Characteristics have been embedded at the school with students at every age engaging in the 30 habits, attitudes, skills and applications of 21st century learning. Among the examples shared were a rap song written and performed by first graders about the Learner Characteristics, a buddy program between first and fourth graders that demonstrated many of them, and the fifth grade Student Ambassador work designed with the purpose of giving the students more ownership in Abe's Way.

Public Participation

A number of parents addressed the Board on an administrative recommendation to uphold a
recommendation of the Reconsideration Committee to retain the novel "The Perks of Being a
Wallflower" by Stephen Chbosky as a classroom resource for independent reading. Parents Kate
Altman, Jen and Brian Bradfield and Linda Bertrand noted that the book is controversial, objected to
the book's mature theme and graphic language and said that it had been banned in other high

school district libraries. Parents also noted that they should have a voice in determining what is appropriate for their children and parents asked that the book be removed from Hadley.

Hadley Literacy teacher Lynn Bruno spoke on behalf of Hadley's literacy program and was in support of retaining the book as independent reading for the classroom. She noted that the book in question is a free choice book not used in direct instruction and that the value of literature is that it is subjective and parents always have the last say.

Jeff Cooper noted that he has fiscal issues with the district and asked for more transparency on district
expenditures. He also raised issues with the recently negotiated teacher's agreement regarding
insurance, the number of sick days, etc. and noted that there should be more public discussion before
another contract is negotiated.

Board members Drew Ellis moved and Terra Costa Howard seconded to approve the reports and recommendations contained in the consent agenda including:

On a roll call answering "Aye": Vondrak, Howard, Black, Ellis, Smith and Nelson; answering "Nay": None. Motion carried.

- B. Superintendent's Recommendations: At its April 8, 2013 Regular Board meeting, the Board discussed the following Administrative recommendations:
 - 2013-2014 Student Fees: No change in student fees for the 2013-2014 school year. Basic fees
 are Early Childhood and kindergarten, \$56.00; elementary, \$75.00; and Hadley, \$115.00.
 Activity fees at Hadley are: first activity, \$30.00; second activity, \$15.00; third activity, \$7.50;
 and fourth activity, \$3.75. Fees for items such as gym uniforms, assignment books, recorders
 and yearbooks will be determined based on the cost of the items, information that will not be
 available until the spring.

Board members Drew Ellis moved and Terra Costa Howard seconded to approve the administration's recommendation as presented.

Mr. Black asked for clarification on the dollar amount for each activity and questioned the necessity for assessing parents a basic fee charge. Mr. Smith suggested using excess fund

balance reserves to cover the cost of what the district would collect for basic fees (approximately \$253,000). Dr. Riebock said that she would not recommend using fund balance reserves for operational costs and that it is really more a matter of examining and/or revising the budget.

Board members Sam Black moved and Dan Smith seconded to amend the motion on the floor to eliminate the charge for basic fees and keep the activity fees.

Mrs. Nelson suggested that the Board move this discussion to the Finance Committee in order to have a deeper discussion.

Sam Black moved and Terra Costa Howard seconded to withdraw his amended motion; to table the discussion and to bring the matter back to the Finance Committee for examination and further discussion as a part of the budget discussion. On a roll call vote answering "Aye": Howard, Black, Ellis, Smith, Vondrak and Nelson; answering "Nay": Motion carried.

2. Adoption of Amendment to District 41 403(b) Retirement Plan: The Board of Education approves a Resolution Adopting Amendment to Glen Ellyn School District 41 403(b) Retirement Plan.

Board members Drew Ellis moved and Sam Black seconded to approve the administration's recommendation as presented. On a roll call vote answering "Aye": Black, Ellis, Smith, Vondrak, Howard and Nelson; answering "Nay" None. Motion carried.

3. Hadley LMC Technology Refresh: The Board of Education approve the refresh of the Hadley Library Media Center (LMC) as a part of this summer's remodeling project which would include the acquisition of 33 iMac desktops and two Mac Pro servers in the amount of \$50,103.27 with a five-year fair market value lease through American Capital Leasing. Annual cost for the equipment will be \$10,580.66; total cost for this investment will be \$52,903.30 at the end of the five- year commitment.

Mr. Vondrak noted that all the Mac stock had been pulled in Europe and cautioned the district about purchasing this month. Smith asked for clarification on the grand total cost.

Board members Sam Black moved and Drew Ellis seconded to approve the administration's recommendation as presented. On a roll call vote answering "Aye": Ellis, Smith, Vondrak, Howard, Black and Nelson; answering "Nay": None. Motion carried.

4. Elementary Music Department iPad Proposal: The Board of Education approves the purchase of 20 iPads from Apple with funds from the 2012/2013 budget in the amount of \$11,160, as well as \$888 in apps. The apps will also be purchased with funds from the 2012/2013 budget. The total cost of the project is \$12,048.

The Board discussed future accountability as it relates to the usage of these apps.

Board members Drew Ellis moved and Erica Nelson seconded to approve the administration's recommendation as presented. On a roll call vote answering "Aye": Smith, Vondrak, Howard, Black, Ellis and Nelson; answering "Nay": None. Motion carried.

5. Confirming the Process for the 2013 Amended Budget: The Board of Education ratify and confirm making the amended budget available in tentative form beginning April 9, 2013, publishing notice on April 11, 2013, of the availability of the amended budget and of the public hearing scheduled to begin at 7:15 p.m. on May 13, 2013 at Benjamin Franklin School.

Board members Sam Black moved and Drew Ellis seconded to approve the administration's recommendation as presented. On a roll call vote answering "Aye": Vondrak, Howard, Black, Ellis, Smith and Nelson; answering "Nay": None. Motion carried.

6. Request for Reconsideration of Library Resources: The Board of Education uphold the recommendation of the Reconsideration Committee to retain the book, <u>Perks of Being a Wallflower</u> by Stephen Chbosky at Hadley for independent reading by 8th grade students only and not to be used for instructional purposes. Parents will be notified each trimester by a letter that discusses the importance of parental awareness of student's book choices.

Board members shared their perspectives on the matter. Below is a summary of their comments.

Mr. Black acknowledged the sensitivity of this topic and said that he is very reluctant when it comes to the topic of censorship. He did not read the book or see the movie but was provided with passages and said that he felt the book was not age appropriate for a middle school environment.

Mrs. Howard said that she read the book as did both of her daughters read the book and does not support the effort of banning books.

Mr. Smith said that while he too is against censorship, he is not comfortable with not knowing what books are being made available to his child. There doesn't appear to be a solid process for the checking and rating process and is not comfortable upholding the recommendation.

Mr. Ellis not in favor of censorship but does not think the book is age appropriate material for the middle school environment.

Mr. Vondrak not in favor of censorship but does not think the book is age appropriate material for the middle school environment. It appears as though we have classroom teachers making decisions on a child's reading material without parent involvement and this is a parental decision.

Mrs. Nelson read the book and noted that the issue is challenging because on either side of the argument it is subjective on some level. The book might not be appropriate for one child but on the other hand it may for another, depending on their maturity level. Where do you draw the line?

Board members Sam Black moved and Terra Costa Howard seconded to approve the administration's recommendation as presented. On a roll call vote answering "Aye": Howard, Nelson; answering "Nay": Black, Ellis, Smith, and Vondrak. Motion failed.

Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Dr. Ann Riebock reported on the following matters:

- Enrollment remains stable. (Attachment)
- Employee health benefit renewal rates for next year are favorable at an increase for PPO of 0.1% and HMO of 2.8%
- Assistant principal positions have been reinstated at the elementary buildings which have shared two assistant principals for the past three years. Dr. Riebock thanked the Board for its support
- Hadley String Orchestra, conducted by Georgia Alemis was the only orchestra in Illinois to earn "Honor Status" at the recent Illinois Grade School Music Association competition.

Board Reports

- A. Board Committee Reports
 - 1. Finance: Chairman of the Finance Committee Drew Ellis reported on the committee meeting earlier that evening during which was discussed the tentative FY 2014 budget, a proposal for new lunch tables and new technology for the physical education program.
 - 2. Policy: Sam Black reported that the Committee will meet on May 1 to review Section I, PRESS policies and to finalize the Process map for Board Policy review.

B. Other:

- Dan Smith attended Lincoln PTA. Highlights including installing officers and discussion about the consolidation of Districts 41 and 89.
- Sam Black attended Lincoln Talent Night and noted a record number of participants; Spring Band Concert on April 16 at Glenbard Legislative Forum on April 22 and Lincoln DARE graduation for 5th graders.
- Erica Nelson attended the Spring Annual meeting for the DuPage West Region for PTA and noted that all the District 41 PTA's earned regional awards for their work and that Abraham Lincoln had earned a state award for the Crayola project. Mrs. Nelson also reported on her attendance at the April 22 Legislative Forum and the April 25 LEND meeting.

Discussion Items

A. Copier Paper Bid Results: The Board discussed the administration's recommendation to approve a copier bid from Unisource Worldwide, Inc. The Call to Bid was advertised on February 21, 2013, for an opening on March 7, 2013. Below is a summary of the bid breakdown.

This matter is scheduled for Board action at the May 13, 2013 meeting.

B. Elementary LMC and Classroom Laptop Refresh: The Board discussed the administration's recommendation to provide new technology for all four elementary schools Library Media Centers as well as mobile technology for all four elementary school classrooms. The recommendation is part of the District's Three-Year Technology Plan that calls for one-to one student access to technology to be achieved over the next three years. With the shift to online assessments and the demands of 21st century instruction, mobile devices are more appropriate than the traditional computer labs.

Each elementary LMC will instead be supplied with 38 new laptops that can be used by a full class or split up for small group work. Laptops will provide for a small, mobile and flexible platform while still powerful enough to handle the same processing needs as the classroom technology.

The total hardware needed for this recommendation is 150 laptops for the LMC's and 1650 laptops for the elementary classrooms for a total of 1800 laptops. The total number of iPads needed will be 150 to be divided among the 4 schools. Administration contacted Heartland Business Systems and Tiger Direct for laptop pricing and Apple for iPad pricing, the results are below.

Additional Costs and Information: A total of 200 laptop carts will also be needed to secure and power the laptops and iPads. The unit cost of the storage cart is \$1,212.90 and the total cost will be \$242,580.00. The carts will be purchased through a 5 year, dollar buyout lease with American Capital leasing. The annual cost of the lease will be \$50,960.00, after 5 years the total investment will be \$252,283.20 and the district will keep the carts.

The administration is recommending approval of the acquisition of 1800 HP 6470b laptops from Tiger Direct through a three-year fair market value lease with American Capital Leasing. The annual cost of the lease will be \$377,487. At the end of the lease the total investment will be \$1,132,461 and the laptops will be returned to American Capital Leasing. The administration will also recommend at the May 13, 2013, board meeting that the board approves the acquisition of 150 iPads from Apple through a three-year fair market value lease with American Capital Leasing. The annual cost of the lease will be \$27,222.73 with the total at the close of the lease will be \$81,668.19.

This matter is scheduled for Board action at the May 13, 2013 meeting.

C. 2013 Classroom Furniture Bid Results: The Board discussed the administration's recommendation to update 32, 21st century elementary classrooms and purchase furniture related to the Hadley LMC remodeling project for a total cost of \$439,688.

A school furniture bid was published on February 28, 2013, with a due date of March 22, 2013. A summary of the bid results is attached as a reference.

The typical elementary classroom will include:

- 25 student desks and chairs 21st century model classroom
- 1 teacher desks, chairs, file cabinets and planner activity tables
- 8 Hokki rockers
- 8 beanbag chairs
- 1 computer table and chairs

Bid results were returned with a fully assembled cost of (K-5) \$213,237.08. The total cost of this recommendation was originally estimated at \$297,500 and will be included in the proposed 2014 fiscal year budget.

Also included in the furniture bid is the Hadley LMC remodeling project. The total cost of furniture replacement in the Hadley LMC is \$135,963.43 with all equipment fully assembled. This furniture cost was originally estimated at \$150,000 and will be included in the proposed 2014 fiscal year budget.

Implementation of the (K-5) STEAM concept has been endorsed by the board. Original estimated cost for this purchase totaled \$100,000. Bids were returned with a fully assembled cost of \$77,964.87.

The district annually purchases a number of items that have been identified by the building principals for replacement. The total value of these purchases is \$12,522.68.

Total cost of all purchases was originally estimated at \$556,200. After bidding the fully assembled cost of these purchases total \$439,688.06.

Additional Costs and Information: Additional costs associated with this recommendation include the cost of carpeting for each of the 21st century classrooms estimated at \$1,400 per classroom (\$44,800).

The Board expects to take action on this matter at its May 13, 2013 meeting.

D. 2013 Summer Painting Project: The Board discussed the administration's recommendation to approve the low bid for its 2013 summer painting project in the amount of \$118,580.

On February 28, 2013, the district published a legal advertisement soliciting bids for its 2013 summer painting project at Hadley Jr. High. Each of the elementary schools has been painted with a plan developed to provide for its own unique characteristics and to align with the 21st century classroom concept. Hadley is the final school to be painted in the current refresh cycle. A public bid opening was held on the due date of March 22, 2013. Five vendors participated and submitted bids. Bid results are detailed in the table below:

Public Participation

- Parent Betsy Pringle said that this was her first time attending a board meeting and was
 encouraged by the discussion. Mrs. Pringle suggested going forward that books considered to be
 borderline in content could be reviewed and rated by teachers and then sent home to parents.
- Lynn Bruno noted that she was upset with the Board's decision to remove "Perks of a Wallflower" from Hadley and said that it disturbs her as an educator and as a taxpayer. She asked if the Board had received all of the information that was reviewed by the Reconsideration Committee (i.e. letters from teachers and students) so as to make an informed decision.

- Parent Kate Altman asked the Board clarifying questions relative to literature censorship, what is allowed in the libraries and classrooms and about teacher discretion. Dr. Riebock said that she would be happy to contact Mrs. Altman to further discuss the matter.
- Mr. Bradfield thanked the Board for its decision to overturn the Reconsideration Committee's decision.

Adjourn to Closed Session

At 9:34 p.m. Board members Sam Black moved and Terra Costa Howard seconded to adjourn to closed session to discuss the following matters:

- A. Collective negotiating matters between the District and its employees or their representatives, or deliberations concerning salary schedules for one or more classes of employees.
- B. The appointment, employment, compensation, discipline, performance, or dismissal of specific employees of the District or legal counsel for the District, including hearing testimony on a complaint lodged against an employee or against legal counsel for the District to determine its validity.
- C. The purchase or lease of real property for the use of the District, including meetings held for the purpose of discussing whether a particular parcel should be acquired.

On a roll call vote answering "Aye": Ellis, Smith, Vondrak, Howard and Black; answering. "Nay": None. Motion carried.

Monthly Revenue/Expenditure Summary Report Overview March 2013

Revenues:

Excluding fund transfers, district revenues collected are \$24,246,552.11 during fiscal year 2013 vs. 2012 revenues of \$25,345,407.14 representing a reduction of \$1,098,855.03. The district has received less revenue in the areas of property tax collection, as the result of the abatement of the Bond & Interest Levy and receipt of general state aid and categorical funds from the State of Illinois. The district has experienced an increase in revenues from tuition payments and food services.

Expenditures:

Excluding fund transfers, district expenditures are \$32,285,541.49 during fiscal year 2013 vs. 2012 expenditures of \$30,100,097.25 representing an increase of \$2,185,444.24. Payments for salaries and benefits total \$20,901,669.24 for fiscal year 2013 vs. \$20,508,610.36 for 2012. Retro salaries were paid during the month of March as the result of the recently concluded GEEA negotiations. The district has spent more for purchased services, supplies & materials, tuition and capital outlay. These amounts will be monitored closely in the coming months.

The undersigned hereby certifies that he/she is Secretary of the Board of Education of the Glen Ellyn School District 41 (the "District"), a governmental entity organized and existing under the laws of the State/Commonwealth of Illinois, and that the following resolution was duly adopted by the Glen Ellyn School District 41 Board of Education (the "Board") and was enacted pursuant to the authority granted to the Board and recorded in its minutes at a meeting of said Board at which a quorum was present on the 29th day of April, 2013, and that the same has not been amended or rescinded and is in full force and effect:

Resolution Adopting Amendment to Glen Ellyn School District 41 403(b) Retirement Plan

WHEREAS, the District currently offers the Glen Ellyn School District 41 403(b) Retirement Plan (the "Plan") to give its employees the opportunity to save additional funds for retirement; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to amend the Plan, effective as of the date of adoption; and

WHEREAS, there has been presented to the meeting a copy of the proposed amendment to the Plan; and

WHEREAS, after full discussion, the adoption and execution of the amendment to the Plan appear to be in the best interest of the District and its employees;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby:

RESOLVED, that the Plan be amended substantially in the form presented below and that such amendment to the Plan is hereby adopted and approved by the Board, effective as of the date of adoption:

ARTICLE 8.1, "Eligible Rollover Contributions to the Plan", shall be restated in its entirety as follows:

8.1 Eligible Rollover Contributions to the Plan.

(a) Eligible Rollover Contributions. To the extent permitted in the Individual Agreement(s), an Employee who is a Participant who is entitled to receive an eligible rollover distribution from another eligible retirement plan may request to have all or a portion of the eligible rollover distribution paid to the Plan. Such Rollover Contributions shall be made in the form of cash only. The Administrator and/or Vendor may require such documentation from the distributing plan as it deems necessary to effectuate the rollover in accordance with Code section 402 and to confirm

that such plan is an eligible retirement plan within the meaning of Code section 402(c)(8)(B).

However, in no event does the Plan accept a rollover contribution from a Roth elective deferral account under an applicable retirement plan described in Code section 402A(e)(1) or a Roth IRA described in Code section 408A.

- (b) <u>Eligible Rollover Distributions</u>. For purposes of Section 8.1(a), an eligible rollover distribution means any distribution of all or any portion of a Participant's benefit under another eligible retirement plan, except that an eligible rollover distribution does not include:
 - (1) a payment if it is part of a series of equal (or almost equal) payments that are made at least once a year and that will last for:
 - (i) the life of the Participant (or the joint lives of the Participant and the Participant's Beneficiary),
 - (ii) the life expectancy of the Participant (or the joint life and last survivor expectancy of the Participant and the Participant's Beneficiary) or
 - (iii) any installment payment for a period of ten (10) years or more;
 - (2) any distribution made as a result of an unforeseeable emergency or other distribution which is made upon hardship of the Participant;
 - (3) for any other distribution, the portion, if any, of the distribution that is a required minimum distribution under Code section 401(a)(9);
 - (4) corrective distribution of excess contributions under a qualified cash or deferred arrangement described in Treasury Regulations section 1.401(k)-2(b)(2) and excess aggregate contributions described in Treasury Regulations section 1.401(m)-2(b)(2), together with the income allocable to these distributions;
 - (5) loans that are treated as deemed distributions pursuant to Code section 72(p) and
 - (6) similar items designated by the Commissioner of Internal Revenue in revenue rulings, notices and other guidance published in the Internal Revenue Bulletin.

In addition, an eligible retirement plan means an individual retirement account described in Code section 408(a), an individual retirement annuity described in Code section 408(b), a qualified trust described in Code section 401(a), an annuity plan described in Code sections 403(a) or

403(b), or an eligible governmental plan described in Code section 457(b), that accepts the eligible rollover distribution.

(c) <u>Separate Accounts</u>. The Vendor(s) providing the Funding Vehicle(s) in which the eligible rollover distribution is invested shall establish and maintain for the Participant a separate account for any eligible rollover distribution paid to the Plan.

and
