



Are you in need of holiday assistance?

DuPage County Free Christmas and Holiday Assistance.

Christmas toys, meals and gifts are provided to some low-income families in DuPage County. The majority of the primary agencies to contact are noted below. They may not only help during the Christmas holiday season, but some charities or town offices will also offer Thanksgiving meals as well.

The goal of most of these organizations is to spread joy throughout the community. A child from a struggling household should not go without a present (whether a toy or clothing) to open Christmas morning. In addition, senior citizens and the disabled should have some type of free meal as well as companionship. These groups of individuals are many of the main beneficiaries of the holiday programs in the region.

Gifts are provided first come first served and are limited. Register at one of the DuPage County agencies as early as possible for assistance, or even ask a local town office for referrals to toy programs, as many of them also provide help.

Society of St. Vincent DePaul

This charity is part of the Toys for Tots program of DuPage County. They pass out gifts to those families with children that meet the criteria in place. The toys are new and donated from the public. Examples may be dolls for girls, trucks, games, and new clothing too, including winter coats.

Vouchers for clothing

While not just available during the holidays (it runs year round), and not specifically a Christmas service, the county provides referrals to this for very low-income families/people in poverty. Winter attire, hats, boots, gloves, and more may be offered. The applicant needs to be referred through Client Services (630-407-6500). It is run in partnership with charities such as Repeat Boutique and pantries.

Salvation Army season programs

These centers help the vulnerable and working poor. The assistance is combined with case management. During the fall and winter, donations are used from Adopt-a-Family to provide Christmas or Thanksgiving meals, toys, presents, and more. Catholic Charities Holiday Outreach Program. Residents of DuPage County can receive gifts and gift certificates during the holidays from the Catholic Charities Holiday Outreach Program. Each family in need completes a Christmas wish list of items they want and donor families will give them money or gift certificate donations to help them get the items on their list. https://catholiccharitiesjoliet.org/holiday-outreach-program/

Bloomingdale Township Sharing Tree. The Bloomingdale Township places a Christmas tree decorated with paper Christmas bells at each of their township offices from mid November to mid December. These paper bells are given to children of low-income families to fill out; which are then taken by people and organizations willing to help. Salvation Army's Angel Tree Program. Families suffering from low-income can sign their children up for the Salvation Army's Angel Tree program. Once signed up, anonymous donors will "adopt" your children and give your family with clothes and toys for Christmas. They also hold annual sit down Christmas dinners that include free food, stocking stuffers, and food pantry items. DuPage Children's Museum
