FULL DAY KINDERGARTEN COMING FALL 2025

In June 2023, the Board of Education voted to move forward with the planning process necessary to build an addition at Churchill Elementary School that will provide space to offer full day kindergarten to District 41 students. The addition will include 12 classrooms and will serve all full day kindergarten students across the district. Families will still have the option to choose half day kindergarten at their home schools.

This work has been ongoing for the past 16 years through conversations, committees, and studies on this topic. The timing of this project is significant as the Governor signed a bill that will require school districts to offer full day kindergarten by the 2027-28 school year. The district will continue to provide information about the planning process with regular reports to the Board of Education and the community in the coming months.

PRESCHOOL PROGRAM RECEIVES GOLD CIRCLE STATUS

District 41 was notified by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) that the District 41 Preschool for All (PFA) Program has again achieved a Gold Circle of Quality status in ExceleRate Illinois—the state's quality recognition and improvement system for early learning and development programs.

SUPERINTENDENT SEARCH UPDATE

Superintendent Dr. Melissa Kaczkowski will be retiring at the end of this school year, 2023-24, after over 35 years in education. The Board of Education has selected the search firm School Exec Connect to lead the process to select the next superintendent for Glen Ellyn School District 41. The firm expects the

Board to approve a new superintendent by January 2024. Thank you to the community members who participated in focus groups and filled out the community survey. The new superintendent will officially begin on July 1, 2024.

NEW MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLNESS RESOURCES

Mental Health Resources

District 41 is excited to announce the upcoming rollout of several new mental health and wellness supports for families. These supports are funded through a Congressional Community Grant with Congressman Sean Casten supporting the district grant application. District 41 is committed to providing the following through the grant funding awarded to the district:

- Access to an online support platform for all District 41 families called Parent Guidance. In addition to a website, one-on-one direct parent coaching will be offered to parents by clinicians, and webinars will be held on a number of mental health topics throughout the year.
- Implementation of a specialized platform designed for students in middle school and older called Kooth. Kooth provides a range of support for students via an app. Students will have access to informational courses, clinician facilitated chat sessions that are anonymous, as well as access to a licensed clinician through direct text.
- Partnership with the YWCA called Strong Families will also offer direct support through a home visit model.

The goal is to increase access to mental health and wellness support outside of the school day. In addition, the district will put the decision making about using these resources in the hands of parents and guardians as a way to partner with parents to support families. This is an unprecedented level of support being offered through a school district. District 41 is the only district making tiered supports available in this way to all families.

STUDENT BOARD MEMBERS SEATED

the grade levels at Hadley and will serve for the remainder of this school year. They were officially seated at the regular Board meeting on October 16, 2023.

"Effective governance requires a collaborative, respectful and future oriented mindset and we are fortunate to have these three impressive Hadley students joining the D41 School Board. Their presence will be a constant reminder of the students and families we are dedicated to serving," said Board President Dr. Robert Bruno.

Keira Boynton is the representative for 7th grade.

"This student is respectful while socializing and understands the dynamics of different groups," said one peer recommendation. "This student is good and careful with her words and makes sure not to interrupt." A teacher who recommended Keira shared, "I am thrilled this student stepped forward to apply for this position."

Evelyn Carle is the representative for 6th grade.

One peer recommendation read, "This student is the most responsible student I know. This student is always on time with assignments and is very well behaved. This student is a wonderful

public speaker. This student has been in two Hadley plays and is very comfortable speaking in front of others."

Carlos Quintero is the representative for 8th grade.

One of his peers shared, "He is nice and polite as well as friendly to everybody. He is a leader, he can take charge with his responsibility and intelligence." A staff member's recommendation included this about Carlos, "Carlos brings a positive, can-do attitude to school every day."

The role of student Board members is to provide advisory input to the District 41 Board of Education. As student members, they have the unique ability to represent the student voice during Board conversations and decisions. Student Board members are not voting members of the Board and they will not have access to confidential information.

NEW BOARD MEMBER APPOINTED

The District 41 Board of Education took action on September 26, 2023 to appoint **Dr. Stephen Miko** to fill a vacant Board position.

Dr. Miko has been a resident within the school district boundaries for 22 years. In his application to become a Board member, he shared, "I believe that access to education is a right to all young people in the community, regardless of individual circumstances. Successful learning must be in a safe and welcoming environment, free from bullying and outside distractions. Teaching methods should be technologically innovative when possible and include audio, visual, kinesthetic, and experiential learning."



Dr. Miko is full-time professor of Criminal Justice Studies at Sauk Valley Community College. Prior to this position, he served as a police officer in Glen Ellyn for 20 years before retiring and starting a new career. During his time with the Glen Ellyn Police Department, he served in Glen Ellyn schools as a juvenile officer and as a community education officer. He also taught D.A.R.E. in all of the elementary schools. In addition, he served as the Glenbard West High School resource officer.



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

High Impact Tutoring with Glen Ellyn Children's Resource Center



A new high-impact tutoring program, in partnership with the Glen Ellyn Children's Resource Center (GECRC). will be offered at Churchill School. The goal of the program is to work towards closing the achievement gap

in the district. This program will support students who show the greatest achievement gaps in learning due to lack of resources and opportunities. Students who attend GECRC are eligible for this specialized academic program: targeting those with high academic support needs.

TUTORS NEEDED

Tutors must be over 18 years old and complete training through GECRC and D41. This is separate from the current GECRC volunteers. High-impact tutoring in this program will include:

- Small group tutoring (2-4 students in a group) by the same tutor three days per week
 - ~Grades 1-3: 30 minutes ~Grades 4-5: 45 minutes
- Sustained and strong relationships between students and their tutors
- Close monitoring of student knowledge and skills
- Alignment with District 41 curriculum literacy focused
- Oversight of tutors to assure quality interactions
