The calendar for next school year is in the process of being developed. The calendar will look somewhat different next year as we are adjusting to the referendum construction schedule including the construction of a new secure entryway at Churchill School and the building addition at Hadley Junior High School.



The calendar committee is proposing starting a week later on August 29 with the tentative last day of school on June 6. Also, the District will use

national holidays for Institute Days. The Tuesday after Columbus Day will no longer be used as an Institute Day. It will be a school attendance day. These adjustments are temporary only due to construction and the need for extra time to complete the projects during the summer months.
