

As colder weather approaches, please familiarize yourself with school closure notification procedures. School closures due to weather will be communicated to all families in the following ways:

In addition, closure announcements can also be sent directly via text messaging to parents who sign up. If you are a parent and would like to receive emergency messages on your cell phone via text (in addition to email and voicemail), please follow the below steps:

- 1. Log on to Family Access Click here
- 2. Click the Skylert button on the left.
- 3. The Skyward contacts screen will appear for the different types of notifications. Scroll to the bottom of the screen and enter your cell phone number(s) in the "Text Message" section.
- 4. Click Save.

The District typically informs families of a closure due to weather as soon as possible the morning of the closure. Closures are decided upon based on the severity of the weather.

Please note: Elementary students must dress appropriately for the weather because they will be outdoors for play except in very cold or inclement weather. During the winter season, students must wear boots and snow pants if they wish to play in the snow outside of the blacktop area. As a general rule, children will not be outdoors when the actual temperature or wind chill factor is below 10 degrees Fahrenheit. See <u>Student Handbook</u>, page 5.
