A tour of the 21st Century model classrooms from 7:15-7:30 p.m. preceded the regularly scheduled meeting.

Call to Order

The Board of Education meeting was called to order at 7:37 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance

Mr. Ellis led in the recital of the Pledge of Allegiance

Roll Call

Upon the roll being called, the following answered present: Ellis, Kenwood, Vondrak, Smith, Howard, Black and Nelson.

Public Participation

There were no members of the public present who wished to address the board.

Presentations, Reports and Initiative Updates

Benjamin Franklin School Presentation: Led by principal Kirk Samples, the school presentation focused on the two 21st Century model classrooms at Franklin and highlights of student learning projects presented by fourth-grade teacher Sarah Rodriguez and fifth-grade teacher Suzie Smith that demonstrated how students are utilizing the Learner Characteristics in project/problem based learning experiences. The Benjamin Franklin presentation concluded with a video titled "21st Century Learning—Own It!" that was created for the January 17 Institute Day. The video, inspired by Good Morning America's "My Three Words" segment included staff and students with their own three words that captured attitudes and characteristics of 21st Century learners.

Mr. Samples thanked the Administration and the Board for the opportunity as well as the educators and students who have embraced the challenge.

Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Dr. Ann Riebock reported on the following matters:

A. Enrollment through December 22, 2011 remains stable. Board member Sam Black noted that the district has 474 kids in portable classrooms this month.

Board Reports

- A. Terra Costa Howard attended the Learning Leadership Team meeting (LLT). Highlights of the meeting included:
 - Worked with CIT and PDT to create opening activity for January Institute Day.
 - Worked on power point slides highlighting the different Learner Characteristics.
 - Selected 10 of the D41 Learner Characteristics to emphasize with staff.
 Mrs. Howard thanked Assistant Superintendent Karen Carlson for highlighting Learner
 Characteristics with staff and said that noticeable changes have occurred this year during discussions, meetings, etc. regarding staff awareness of the District's Learner Characteristics.
- B. Dan Smith reported on Calendar Committee meeting outcomes and noted that the committee is hopeful that it will have a draft calendar for the 2012-2013 school year to present to the Board in February. He further noted that the committee has had good, positive discussions and he is pleased to note that despite the addition of President's Day back in to the calendar, an additional 5-day week has been created.

C. Erica Nelson reported on the following:

- CIT meeting this past Thursday. Highlights of the meeting included:
 - Began the work of developing roadmaps for the messaging, leadership and communication of the LRP
 - > Discussed and defined expectations for the mid-year BLT reports in February.
 - > PDT reported an excellent response to the January 17th Techno Blast Institute Day
- January 20 LEND meeting is focused on transportation funding options.
- Abraham Lincoln International Night: Great turn out and snap shot of Lincoln and its energy through PTA.
- Board President's meeting has been moved to Tuesday, January 24, 2:15 p.m.

Discussion Items

- A. Supplemental Pay Committee Recommendation: The board discussed the administration's recommendation for the addition of a wresting coach to the supplemental pay schedule and moving cross country from a Group IV activity to a Group II activity. Dr. Riebock noted that this recommendation was discussed at an earlier Finance Committee meeting and asked the board to consider both a discussion and action on this request later in the evening. The projected net increase of these two changes is \$6,521 per year. The board will take action on the matter later in the meeting.
- B. Class Size Targets: For the last six years, the class size targets have been as follows.
 - 20-22 students per class in grades K-2
 - 23-25 students per class in grade 3
 - 25-27 students per class in grades 4-5
 - 26-28 students per class in grades 6-8

The district also has a practice of considering smaller class sizes when academic performance of a grade level is significantly below the district norm, or when all sections at a school's grade level are significantly over target. Typically, a decision is made during the summer upon review of the student assessment data. The administration is recommending the following guidelines for use when considering staffing below the targets within available resources.

- The academic performance of a grade level at a particular school is significantly below the norm for the district. Grade level MAP Testing results and ISAT results will be used as the comparative measure.
- Class sizes across a grade level rise to at least an average of two students above the grade level target.

The review and, if necessary, recommendation for additional staff would be completed by the administrative team.

Dr. Riebock asked the board to consider a reduction of the target at Churchill and Lincoln in grades 4 and 5 to the third grade level, which is 23 -25 as opposed to 25-27. Approval of this reduction would allow the Human Resource department and the principals to hire the position sooner or retain a teacher as appropriate rather than waiting until much later in the summer. The Board will take action on this recommendation at its February 13, 2012 Regular Board meeting.

C. Hadley Auditorium Sound System Replacement: As a part of its long-range capital improvement plan, the administration is proposing a phased project to improve the sound system in the auditorium (pods) at Hadley Junior High School. On October 27, 2011, District 41 went out for bid to replace the sound system at Hadley Jr. High. Below is an illustration of the bid submittals and pricing.

The administration is recommending the purchase of the sound system from Muzak at a cost of \$27,096. Additional costs are estimated at approximately \$5,000 for the installation of sound dampening devices. The Board will take action on the administration's recommendation at its February 13, 2012 Regular meeting.

- B. Resolution Abating 2011 Tax Levy for Debt Service Payments for 1998 and 2004 Bonds: At an earlier meeting, the board discussed the administration's recommendation to abate \$2,727,800 of the Bond and Interest Levy. Following an interfund transfer of funds from the Education and Operation & Maintenance funds to the Debt Service fund, the attached resolution is required in order to alert the county as to the district's interest in abating.

Mr. Kenwood moved and Mr. Black seconded to approve the administration's recommendation and adopt the attached resolution abating a portion of the tax heretofore levied for the year 2011 to pay the debt service on the District's outstanding General Obligation School Capital Appreciation Bonds, Series 1998, and General Obligation Refunding School Bonds, Series 2004. On a roll call vote answering "Aye": Vondrak, Howard, Black, Ellis, Smith, Kenwood and Nelson; answering "Nay": None. Motion carried.

There were no other matters considered by the board.

Monthly Revenue/Expenditure Summary Report Overview December 2011

Overview

When reviewing the attached Monthly Revenue/Expenditure Summary Report year to year comparisons must take into account the recent unbudgeted transfer of \$2,727,800 from the Education and Operations & Maintenance Fund to the Debt Service. Year to Date revenues and expenditures are much lower and will be taken into consideration in the following written analysis.

Revenues

Overall district revenues are approximately 3.15% less than last year for the same fiscal period. To date, the district has received \$630,629.70 in General State Aid for the current fiscal year. The state has made it a priority to continue to make GSA payments in a timely manner. However, Restricted State Funds continues to be an area of concern. Of the \$1,267,202.61 received to date, only \$1,636.10 is for the current fiscal year, the balance or \$1,265,566.51 is from the 2011 fiscal year. Of this amount the funds received during the months of July and August, \$688,760.53 will be accrued to the 2011 fiscal year. The remainder \$576,805.98, will be recognized in the current 2012 fiscal year. These funds represent reimbursement for categorical expenditures including special education, TBE/TPI, and transportation.

The revenue areas that are lagging from a year ago include receipts for personal property taxes and federal programs.

Please keep in mind that District 41 maintains its operating books on a cash basis and recognizes its revenues and expenditures when received.

Expenditures

Expenditures are less than last year's amount by .35% for the same fiscal period.

Scorecard Summary

The administration has reviewed the criteria established during the Scorecard development process and feels significant progress has been made in aligning budgeted and actual financial results. However, the administration continues to be concerned with the timeliness and lack of state financing and the resulting effect on the district's financial condition.

RESOLUTION abating the tax heretofore levied for the year 2011 to pay debt service on \$10,999,903.75 General Obligation School Capital Appreciation Bonds, Series 1998, and \$9,240,000 General Obligation Refunding School Bonds, Series 2004, of School District Number 41, DuPage County, Illinois.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education (the "Board") of School District Number 41, DuPage County, Illinois (the "District"), by resolutions adopted on the 15th day of December, 1997 (the "Series 1998 Resolution") and the 23rd day of August, 2004 (the "Series 2004 Resolution", and together with the Series 1998 Resolution, the "Resolutions"), did provide for the issue of \$10,999,903.75 General Obligation School Capital Appreciation Bonds, Series 1998, and \$9,240,000 General Obligation Refunding School Bonds, Series 2004, respectively, (collectively, the "Bonds"), and the levy of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay debt service on the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, on the 15th day of December, 1997, and the 17th day of September, 2004, duly certified copies of the Resolutions were filed in the office of the County Clerk of DuPage County, Illinois (the "County Clerk"); and

WHEREAS, the District has surplus funds in the "General Obligation School Capital Appreciation Bonds, Series 1998, Bond Fund" and the "Refunding Bond and Interest Sinking Fund Account of 2004" (collectively, the "Bond Funds") established pursuant to Section 11 of the Series 1998 Resolution and Section 10 of the Series 2004 Resolution, respectively, for the purpose of paying the debt service on the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and in the best interests of the District that the tax heretofore levied for the year 2011 to pay the debt service on the Bonds be abated:

Now, Therefore, Be It and It is Hereby Resolved by the Board of Education of School District Number 41, DuPage County, as follows:

Section 1. Abatement of Tax. The tax heretofore levied for the year 2011 in each of the Resolutions is hereby abated in its entirety.

Secretary of the Board shall file a certified copy hereof with the County Clerk, and it shall be the duty of the County Clerk to abate said tax levied for the year 2011 in accordance with the provisions hereof and as shown hereinabove in Section 1 hereof.

Section 3. Effective Date. This resolution shall be in full force and effect forthwith upon its adoption.
